The Friends of Kenton Rec and Harrow council have welcomed the planting of young trees to create a symbolic 'peace forest' in Kenton Recreation Ground. The trees have been fundraised for by the OneJAIN Community, as part of the Planting for Peace initiative, to commemorate Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary.
